Traveling to Beijing

BEIJING CAPITAL INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (PEK)

Distance to Kempinski Center: 20km Approximately 30-40 minutes' drive, depending on traffic

Collection service available from the airport to the hotel. Please contact Ms. Cara Dong (cara.dong@splendiatravel. com), and give the following code: SAIPConference, as well as your international flight details and number. The company will try to make a group reservation if flight timings permit. The price will vary according to the number of people.

Alternatively, participants can take an official metered **taxi** (about 80 RMB) or the **Airport Express Subway** from the Beijing Capital International Airport to Sanyuanqiao station. Transfer to line ten, going south, where you exit at the next stop, Liangmaqiao station. From the station, follow exit C to arrive directly at the Youyi shopping city of the Kempinski Beijing Lufthansa Center.

Directions by car: Take the Capital Airport express way. At the end, turn onto the third ring road heading south. The hotel will be on your left-hand side.

Travel requirements

Participants from most countries will be required to obtain a Visa to enter the People's Republic of China. To avoid uncertainty, participants are advised to apply for a Visa as early as possible, and at least one month in advance.

Recommendation

Beijing's air quality might be an issue on some days.

We suggest bringing an anti-pollution mask.

A recommended model is the 3M® 9332 with exhalation valve to remove moisture from the face.

Temperatures

Beijing weather in April sees a big rise in temperature, with average daily temperatures rising from a cool 10°C (50°F) to a mild 17°C (63°F). Night temperatures average low 8°C (46°F) at the start of April, but above 23°C (74°F) at the end. Sandstorms are possible.

Grain and oilseed field visit: Dezhou City, Shandong province is mild. The average nightly temperature is 7°C (46°F); the average daytime high temperature is 16°C (62°F).

Tea and vegetable field visit: Zhangzhou, Fujian province. The average daytime high temperature in Xiamen in April is a warm 23°C (73°F). Note that Fujian is one of the provinces with the most rainfall in China.

Dairy field visit: Shuangcheng, Heilogjiang province, is warmer but the weather frequently changes. April is still cold at night, with many sunny days. The average nightly low temperature is 0°C (32°F); the average daytime high temperature is 14°C (57°F).

Fruit field visit: Yantai, Shandong province, is mild. The average nightly temperature is 7 °C (46 °F); the average daytime high temperature is 16°C (62°F).
